### THE SCHOOL

West Clermont High School is a four year high school with an enrollment of 2600 students in grades 9-12. West Clermont High School is a brand new high school that combined Amelia High School and Glen Este High School, beginning with the 2017-18 school year. The West Clermont School District is located in a suburban area of southwestern Clermont County, eighteen miles east of downtown Cincinnati. The school is accredited by the State of Ohio Department of Education and the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges.

### THE FACULTY

West Clermont High School has 131 full time faculty and professional staff members, 72% of whom hold a masters degree.

### THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

West Clermont High School has a two semester academic calendar. Classes are offered on a one or two semester basis. Final exams are administered at the conclusion of each semester. Credits are awarded and grade point averages are calculated at the conclusion of each semester. In order to earn a high school diploma, students must earn a total of 20.5 credits and earn a total of 18 points on Ohio's State Tests. Specific subject matter and credit distributions are also required to earn a diploma. A variety of courses are available across all disciplines. West Clermont also offers many Advanced Placement courses, as well as the International Baccalaureate Program.

### GRADE SYSTEM

For the purpose of calculating GPA and class rank, the West Clermont Local School District uses a four point grading scale with the following quality points (used for the 2014-15 and 2015-16 school years):

**A = 4                      B = 3                      C = 2                      D = 1                      F = 0**

Beginning with the 2016-17 school year, the following grading scale is used to calculate GPA:

### WEIGHTED COURSES

Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, students may enroll in dual credit (CCP) courses on the high school campus. GPA and class rank are determined by using the GPA plus an add-on of .025 for each 0.5 credit earned. Beginning with the 2017-18 school year, Honors Courses and IB SL courses earn a partial weight of 0.0125 for each 0.5 credit earned. The following courses are weighted:

In order to receive a weighted grade in AP classes, a student must successfully complete the course and take the AP test in that course. GPA is rounded to four decimal places. All courses are included in figuring grade point average and class rank. Students entering West Clermont High School with GPAs weighted from other schools will receive weighted credit according to these regulations.
